# Honors Program in Foreign Language

The instructor team is comprised of professionals from Indiana University and Indiana high schools. (IUHPFL) integrates high school students into host families with daily instruction in language.

Students conduct all communications in the host country language and adhere
to an honor code for good behavior.

• Instructors receive extensive training for their roles in the program, which include both classroom-based teaching as well as program implementation and experiential learning coordination.



# Enrollments

Summer 2023 locations: three in Spain, two in France, and one in Austria.

One hundred thirty-three students from 58 public and private high schools from Indiana were abroad with HPFL programs this summer





### Financial Assistance

Through the generosity of donors, nearly \$49,000 was awarded to students – enabling IUHPFL to provide funding to 75% of the students who applied for financial support from the program.

Students cited their **host families** and the **language commitment** as the two greatest factors that contributed to their success in the program.



# Long Term Program Outcomes

IUHPFL strives to impact students' lives beyond improving their language skills.

### According to a Survey of Recent HPFL Cohorts:

- Approximately **1/3 of HPFL alumni chose** to attend an **Indiana University** campus after high school.
- **Over 60%** of recent HPFL alumni who graduated from IU studied abroad while in college double the participation rate of the general IU undergraduate population.
- Alumni took an average of 5 foreign language courses each during college, including less-commonly-taught languages.
- They showed a high density of majors in business, international studies, Spanish, & French.
