 Courses with a DEPT—OS 100 equivalent may count towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department for evaluation towards a specific credit either before or after studying abroad.
- A course listed as OS200/300/400 means the academic department has evaluated the course. Be in touch with the academic department to determine how course may fulfill degree requirements.
- Some courses may carry pre-requisites; be sure to check the program's site to determine eligibility.



How to look up Kent classes:

- Go to Kent's catalog of modules website for the most updated list of available courses.
- 1. Modules noted as "Autumn and Spring" are courses that are only offered for the academic year, not individual semesters. Otherwise, Autumn = Fall and Spring = Spring.
- 2. Students may only take classes on the Canterbury campus (not Medway).
- 3. Students should take classes at Level 4, 5, or 6. Level 6 classes should be in a student's major.
- 4. Students may take 15-credit classes (4 IU credits) or 30-credit classes (8 IU credits).
- Students are not able to take Economics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Law, or Physics courses during the fall-only option since Kent does not provide alternative final examination options for these courses.
