Contemporary China & Chinese Language

Select Courses as follows (15 credits total):

1. Required Chinese language Course (6 credits)
2. 2-4 Area studies courses (3 credits each)
3. 2-3 Language Electives (2 credits each)
 - a. *Must be placed into 300 level Chinese or above to be eligible for the language electives*

Important Notes:

- Not all of these courses will be offered each term. The courses listed are those that IU students have taken in the past. They do not represent ALL courses available as part of the program. You can find a potential list of courses available on the [IES Beijing Contemporary China & Chinese Language website](#) (program/provider does not list IU equivalencies).
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by an IUB department. Courses with a DEPT–OS 100 equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for specific credit either before or after studying abroad. If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department.
- IU students who take Mandarin Chinese will need to arrange a placement exam upon completion of the program to determine the next appropriate Chinese language course through the East Asian Languages & Cultures department.
