Select Courses as Follows:

1. Students must take between 12-16 IU credits for the semester
2. One course with African culture content must be taken

Important Notes:

- Not all of these courses will be offered each term. The courses listed are those that IU students have taken in the past. They do not represent ALL courses available as part of the program. You can find the faculties' handbooks [here](#).
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by a department on campus. Courses with –OS 100* equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for major/minor credit either before or after studying abroad depending on departmental policies. If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department.
- The University of Cape Town follows the National Qualifications Framework (NQF) credit system. **IU requires students to take a minimum of 72 NQF credits per semester, equating to 2-4 courses which count for a minimum of 12 IU credits.** Courses may be taken in all University of Cape Town faculties, excluding Health Science.

- **Note:** Course numbers will end either in an “F” or “S” (for fall or spring). Courses noted with a “W” are courses that are only offered for the academic year. However, since South Africa is located in the southern hemisphere, the seasons in South Africa are opposite from the seasons in the U.S. Therefore, the fall semester at UCT is February-July and the spring semester is July-November.

1. #GEN ED: For students who started at IU in the summer 2011 or after and are under the new general education requirements, this course will carry breadth of inquiry A&H credit
2. %GEN ED: For students who started at IU in the summer 2011 or after and are under the new general education requirements, this course will carry breadth of inquiry S&H credit
3. ++ Common Ground AH/SH credit awarded to students on a case-by-case basis
4. + IU Title: Special Topics in Foreign Study (elective credit in COLL)
5. ^ SPEA Topics courses; must obtain advisor approval whether course will apply to specific SPEA major. Students can earn up to two SPEA courses on an OVST study abroad program
6. ^BIOL-OS 300 courses will count towards standard Biology B.A./B.S. majors' on-campus lecture credit. In order to obtain lab credit, you must submit more information about the course including a syllabus to the Biology department for approval
