Academic Year in Freiburg Program

Select Courses as follows (27-30 credits in total)*:

1. Required German Pre-session at the Alpadia Language School (September) (3 credits)
2. AYF Topics Course (3 credits)
3. Required direct enrollment course at local university (at least 3 credits)
 - a. Albert-Ludwigs-Universität
 - b. Pädagogische Hochschule Freiburg
4. Additional Alpadia, SLI, direct enrollment courses, or internship (spring only) (6 credits)

*Students only take pre-session in September. Students will enroll in 15 credits (minimum) in the fall semester and 12 credits (minimum) in the spring semester.

Important Notes:

- Not all of these courses will be offered each term. The courses listed are those that IU students have taken in the past. They do not represent ALL courses available as part of the program. You will not be able to finalize your course schedule until you arrive in Freiburg, but you should review this list and the [Albert-Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg website](#) for a listing of schools, departments, and possible courses.
- In addition to at least one direct enrollment course at a local University, students can also take courses at the [Sprachlehrinstitut](#).
- The AYF topics courses change yearly. Consult the [AYF website](#) for the current topics list.
- The academic year in Freiburg runs from September to the middle of August with a significant break in March.
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by an IUB department. Courses with a DEPT–OS 100 equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for specific credit either before or after studying abroad.
- If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department. Be in touch with the academic department to determine how course may fulfill degree requirements.
- Students should inquire with ksabroad@indiana.edu about business credit.
- Some courses may carry pre-requisites; be sure to check the program's site to determine eligibility.
