

# Germany, Freiburg

## IU Program

### Select Courses as follows (15 credits in total)\*:

1. Required German Pre-session at the Sprachlehrinstitut (SLI) (3 credits)
2. IES Center Courses (strongly recommended) (3 credits)
  - a. Deutsche Geschichte und deutsche Nation nach 1945 (fall)
  - b. Das politische Deutschland heute - ein Land zwischen Vergangenheit Gegenwart und Zukunft (spring)
3. Required direct enrollment course at local university
  - a. Albert-Ludwigs-Universität
  - b. Pädagogische Hochschule Freiburg
4. Additional SLI or direct enrollment courses (6 credits)

\*Academic Year students do not take the pre-session during the spring semester so are only required to complete 12 credits during the spring semester.

### **Important Notes:**

- Not all of these courses will be offered each term. The courses listed are those that IU students have taken in the past. They do not represent ALL courses available as part of the program. You will not be able to finalize your course schedule until you arrive in Freiburg, but you should review this list and the [Albert-Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg web site](#) for a listing of schools departments and possible courses.
- In addition to at least one direct enrollment course at a local University, students can also take courses at the [Sprachlehrinstitut](#).
- The academic year in Freiburg runs from September to the end of July. The spring semester runs from late February to late July.
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by an IUB department. Courses with a DEPT-OS 100 equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for specific credit either before or after studying abroad.
- If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department. Be in touch with the academic department to determine how course may fulfill degree requirements.

- Some courses may carry pre-requisites; be sure to check the program's site to determine eligibility.
