Area Studies & Language Program

Select courses as follows (15-19 credits):

1. Required Spanish language course (level pending placement exam): 4 credits
2. Required IES area studies course (minimum of one course): 3 credits+
3. Additional area studies courses at IES and/or outside university (up to 3 courses in total)
 - a. Optional service learning seminar and placement (4 credits) instead of one outside university course

Important Notes:

- Not all of these courses will be offered each term. The courses listed are those that IU students have taken in the past. They do not represent ALL courses available as part of the program. You can find a potential list of courses available on the [Quito-IES program website](#) (IES does not list IU equivalencies).
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by an IUB department. Courses with a DEPT–OS 100 equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for specific credit either before or after studying abroad. If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department.
- Students are not permitted to take cooking, art, sports, or other "Activities" type courses without written permission from OVST. Student may not use these courses to satisfy minimum enrollment in 15 credits.
