

Rio de Janeiro-CIEE *Liberal Arts Program*

Select courses as follows (16 credits minimum)

1. Required pre-session (ICPL) language and seminar courses
 - Intensive Portuguese (based on placement exam): 4 credits*
2. Required CIEE semester language course
 - Portuguese Language (based on placement exam): 4 credits*
3. Required minimum of 3 courses of direct enrollment courses at Pontifícia Universidade Católica de Rio de Janeiro (PUC-Rio)

**Students who place at the intermediate level may be required to enroll in more intensive language coursework*

Important Notes:

- Courses below may not be offered each term. These courses have been offered in the past and the equivalencies shown indicate how courses have transferred back to IU. Please check the [Rio-CIEE program website](#) or on the [PUC-Rio website](#) for the most up-to-date course offerings (CIEE/PUC-Rio does not list IU equivalencies).
- Students should inquire with ksabroad@indiana.edu about business credit.
- Undistributed 100-level (-OS 100) courses have not yet been evaluated by an IUB department. Courses with a DEPT–OS 100 equivalent will be applied towards overall credits to graduate. However, students may submit the course materials to that department to be evaluated for specific credit either before or after studying abroad.
- If a course is listed as OS200/300/400, the course has been evaluated by the academic department. Be in touch with the academic department to determine how course may fulfill degree requirements.
- Some courses may carry pre-requisites; be sure to check the program's site to determine eligibility.
- Students will work with onsite staff after arrival to select local university courses. Course offerings change frequently and information about required prerequisites is not readily available in advance. Brazilian universities typically do not publish course syllabi.
