SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES AND ADVICE FOR OVERSEAS STUDY IN Fall 2022

- Will study abroad programs be running in Fall 2022, considering the COVID-19 pandemic?
 - O While planning to continue with Fall 2022 semester-long programs, the Office of Overseas Study continues to closely monitor the COVID-19 pandemic and follow guidance from national and international organizations, such as World Health Organization, Centers for Disease Control, and the U.S. Department of State. We also are in touch with our study abroad partners and providers to determine if they are able to host IU students in Fall 2022.
- I have been accepted to a Fall 2022 study abroad program. If I decide not to go, can I get my \$500 prepayment back? Can I defer to a future semester?
 - Generally, students who withdraw from a Fall 2022 program at least 14 days prior to the program start date or whose program is cancelled will be refunded their \$500 prepayment. Students interested in deferring to a future semester (and who are still eligible for that semester) should speak with their study abroad advisor.
- Should I purchase an air ticket for travel to my program destination for Fall 2022?
 - o No. Students are advised to avoid incurring any financial commitments until 60 days prior to program start date.
- If I withdraw from my Fall 2022 program, what happens to any study abroad scholarships I received?
 - Students should not expect to receive any study abroad-related scholarships, if their program abroad is cancelled.
- What should I do about housing at IU, if my Fall 2022 program gets cancelled?
 - Students should consult IU Classifieds or be in touch with Residential Programs and Services about spring housing options.



Fee Schedule Fall 2022 **Intercollegiate Center for Classical Studies in Rome**

The Intercollegiate Center for Classical Studies (ICCS) fee includes academic fees, accommodations, weekday meals, and program sponsored activities and excursions. In late August the Bloomington bursar will send an email notifying you that your statement is available for viewing and printing from the web through IU Bursar Pay. Any IUB scholarships or loans will be listed as credits there. The miscellaneous provider fee includes the noninstructional costs of the program, such as housing and some meals (\$4,495) and Transcript Fee (\$120).

The IU Service fee underwrites the operation of the Office of Overseas Study.
