


STUDY ABROAD IN AUSTRALIA

Study abroad programs available for fall and spring!

Students with an academic interest in Asia and the Pacific – from Georgia in the west to Polynesia in the east – are encouraged to apply for the ANU-IU Pan Asia Institute exchange awards:

- ◆ Up to three undergraduates will be chosen each year for a semester-long exchange at ANU. Students will pay their regular tuition and fees to Indiana University.
- ◆ Accommodations are available on the ANU campus and students are responsible for paying fees associated with such directly to ANU.

Plan early! Allow at least eight to ten months to complete the application process. Advance planning also enables you to explore additional funding opportunities.

All students should work with their academic advisors and explore ANU's web site to ensure that their academic interests and needs can be addressed during an exchange program.

Applications are accepted for the Fall and Spring semesters and additional information is available from the PAI office.

Undergraduate Application Process

- ◆ Apply for the [Canberra Overseas Study Program](#) through the Office of Overseas Study.
- ◆ Be sure to address your interest in pan-Asian studies when responding to the first required overseas study application essay: *Why are you applying to this program? In what specific ways will this program contribute to your overall academic and professional objectives?*
- ◆ Applications are due in February for Fall exchanges and September for Spring programs.

2010-2011 Program Dates

- ◆ Fall: July 19 – October 29, 2010
 - ◆ Application deadline: February 22, 2010
- ◆ Spring: February 21 – June 3, 2011
 - ◆ Application deadline: September 26, 2010
